CORE CONNECTIONS

Enrollment options:
Monday-Friday, full or half days

We believe all students are capable of learning when given access to communication, age-appropriate and interesting material, and a safe and loving environment in which to thrive. Our curriculum is individualized for each student's learning style, strengths, and self-identified areas for growth.

Students can earn all credits needed for a high school diploma or choose to follow an individualized course of study with more emphasis on social-emotional development and life skills. We teach all core academic subjects and a variety of electives:

- American Sign Language
- Health and Sexuality Education
- Music and Fine Arts
- STEM and Robotics
- Cooking and Life Skills
- Physical Education, and more!



NEW CONNECTIONS

Enrollment options:
Five full days/week or three full days/week

Students who have completed the core high school curriculum or are at least 18 years old are eligible to participate in young adult programming.

New Connections prepares students to be self-advocates, contribute to society, and live interdependently. Students practice writing resumes, filling out job applications, sending emails, and interviewing for jobs. They learn life skills such as cooking, cleaning, doing their own laundry, folding and hanging clothes, making the bed, self-care, and home maintenance. Their continued education includes:
